### "HOW CAN I BELIEVE IN... THE HOLY SPIRIT WHEN I HAVE NEVER SEEN HIM?"



Warm greetings to you in the name of our risen Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ.

This month we will commemorate special days, including the festival of the Christian home (Mother's Day), Ascension Sunday, Pentecost Sunday, and the Holy Trinity Sunday. In addition, here at Main Street UMC, we will observe our Music Sunday,

celebrate our graduating high school seniors: Kamon

Blong and Anastasia Spahr, and enjoy the fun of roasting and selling delicious roasted chicken during the Nelson's Port-a-Pit chicken sale. What an exciting month ahead of us! Congratulations to all our mothers, leaders/ members of the music ministry, Kamon and Anastasia and their families, the missions committee, and all warm-hearted family members and friends. These celebrative

occasions are made possible by the Holy Spirit, who *made us*, *gives us life*, *inspiration and understanding* (Job 33:4; 32:8) as both the Church and individual members. So let's talk about the Holy Spirit—the One we celebrate on Pentecost Sunday.

One of the distinguishing marks of the Church is the first Christian Pentecost. The Church was born, empowered, and *added to* at Pentecost when the outpouring of the Holy Spirit occurred. Since the day of Pentecost, a new age of living—the indwelling of the Holy Spirit in the believers began and continues today. Here's how it all started: God revealed to the Prophet Joel that in the far distant future, *He will pour out His Spirit on all flesh* (Joel 2:28 cf. Acts 2:16-21). Later, during Jesus' earthly ministry, Jesus explained the work of the Holy Spirit to His disciples. John captures the explanation clearly: <sup>13</sup> But when he, the Spirit of truth, comes, he will guide you into all the truth. He will not speak on his own; he will speak only what he hears, and he will tell you what is yet to come... <sup>15</sup> All that belongs to the Father is mine. That is why I said the Spirit will receive from me what he will make known to you" (John 16:13-15). These words of Jesus show that the Holy Spirit is a Person. Yes, He is a Person. You can, in fact, you should relate with Him as you would a friend, brother, or sister. In case you are asking, How? Let me tell you a short story I learned from a professor years ago.

A 12-year-old boy walked up to his father and asked, "Dad, how can I believe in the person you called the Holy Spirit when I have never seen Him?" His father, an electrician, promised to show him. One day he took his son to the power plant and he saw the generators working. His father


> then explained to him, "My son, this is where the power that produces light in our house comes from. We cannot physically see the power, but it is in that machine and in the power lines." His father continued, "I am quite sure you believe in electricity, but you don't believe in it because you can see it. When you reach to switch on the light, you simply believe in it because you see what it can do. It is the same way with the Holy Spirit. We

believe in Him because we see what He does in people's lives and creation.

Did you get the point from the above story? The Holy Spirit is real and He is working in our time. If you are born again, I invite you to begin to sense the leading of the Spirit of Jesus intentionally in your day-to-day activities. I am not inviting you to get into a relationship with someone who is not there in your life. Rather, I am inviting you to get into a relationship with someone who is already there in your life, but whom you may hardly recognize. If you are not born again, the good news is, if you surrender your life to Jesus today and ask Him to come into your life as your Savior and Lord, He won't come alone. He will come with the Holy Spirit, and the Holy Spirit will come with spiritual gifts and fruit and use them to nurture, transform, and sustain you in order to fulfill God's good purpose.


After May 16, and through summer, we will not have rehearsals, but there will be special music each Sunday by individuals or groups.

# MISSIONS update


